While we did an initial order for our First Nation students, who you may have seen proudly wearing these shirts already, the shirt is actually available for all students of EPPS to purchase, if they wish. There is no expectation to buy.

If you are interested in purchasing a shirt for your child/ren, please collect an order form from the school office. The cost is **\$45** per shirt. There is a size guide on the order form, but there are some shirts available at school for students to try on to help determine their size. Orders close on Thursday, 10th March, 2022 as we would like them to be available at the start of Term 2 and production and delivery takes 6 weeks.



COVID INFORMATION

The information comes through to my email at various times and days. When I have information to update the community I will do so in the newsletter if it is in line with the day we send it out or through the skoolbag app, facebook or parent emails.

Restrictions on adults visiting the school site are still in place. If you need to pick up your child early for a genuine appointment, please notify the office staff before time then ring them from the school gate when you arrive. Children will be escorted to you at the front gate.

Kindergarten parents are permitted on site to drop off (and leave quickly) and pick up their children in the afternoon. Please wait on the grass **behind the flag poles** (not up behind the ramp) as it is easy for the teachers to see you and allow your child to come to you.

Increasing Numbers of positive cases at school.

Thank you to the many parents who are ensuring they complete the RAT on their child/children each week and then informing us promptly if the result is positive. These responsible parents are much appreciated and helping us to keep everyone as safe as can be.

As we have an increasing number of students with COVID I am not sending out emails everyday as this can be overwhelming and people tend to ignore them. What I am asking parents to do is watch continually for symptoms for all your family, do the twice weekly RAT and keep your children at home if there are any positive cases in your family.

The information regarding isolating etc is our website for your information and I have attached the letters to this newsletter.

We will get through this and please know that at school we are doing all we can to implement every COVID safeguard we can.

Letter that is sent home to advise parents about isolating:

Isolating with COVID-19

Dear Parents or Carers,

Thank you for advising our school that your child has tested positive for COVID-19 or is a close household contact.

Children who test positive or are a close household contact cannot attend school **for 7 days**. Parents and carers of children who are close contacts are advised to monitor their child for symptoms of COVID-19. These include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection).

Should symptoms occur, your child should undertake a rapid antigen test. If a rapid antigen test is positive your child should continue to isolate as someone who has tested positive to COVID-19External link. If you cannot access a rapid antigen test, you can attend a PCR (nose and throat swab) testing clinic. Positive rapid antigen tests should be reported to record the positive RAT result through the Service NSW websiteExternal link or Service NSW appExternal link. Please notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible.

Letter that is sent home to advise parents about casual contact:

Possible Casual Contact for COVID-19

Dear Parents and Carers,

Our school community has recently been advised that students and staff working with your child's stage group may have had contact with a person (staff and/or student) who was infectious with COVID-19.

While testing and isolation is no longer mandatory for exposures in school settings, <u>NSW Health has provided advice on testing and isolation recommendationsExternal link</u> for the community following exposure to COVID-19 that should be considered when making decisions for your child and family.

Staff and students are not able to attend school if they are showing any symptoms of COVID-19. These include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection).

If symptoms occur at any time, your child should not attend school and should undertake a rapid antigen test. If a rapid antigen test is positive your child should isolate as someone who has tested positive to COVID-19External link. If you cannot access a rapid antigen test, you can attend a PCR (nose and throat swab) testing clinic. Positive rapid antigen tests should be reported to record the positive RAT result through the Service NSW websiteExternal link or Service NSW appExternal link.

Please notify the school of the positive RAT or PCR test result as soon as possible. Children will need to follow NSW Health adviceExternal link to isolate for 7 days.
