Keep up the momentum for change: the theme for National Reconciliation Week 2023 is *Be a Voice for Generations*.

The theme encourages all Australians to be a **voice for reconciliation** in tangible ways in our everyday lives – where we **live**, **work** and **socialise**.

For the work of **generations past**, and the benefit of **generations future**, act today for a more **just**, **equitable and reconciled country for all.**

National Reconciliation Week – **27 May to 3 June** – is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

This year we spoke to our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders students about how they would like to mark Reconciliation Week and put their ideas to a vote (as we could not do all the ideas). Here's what they decided.


- 1. Everyone in the school to please colour/ paint/ craft an Aboriginal or Torres Straight Island flag to create a sea of flags around our school flag poles. The flags are now visible on the grassed area near the flag poles.
- 2. Classes play Traditional Indigenous games and sports or join with other classes to play these games.
- 3. All families within the school community were invited to the school to participate in a class Reconciliation Week activity on Tuesday, 30th May from 2pm -3pm.

Aboriginal Dance Workshop at Eagle Vale High School

Yesterday, 11 of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students from Years 3-6 attended an Aboriginal dance workshop at Eagle Vale High School. They joined students from four other schools to learn from experienced First Nation dancers the Brolga Dance Academy.

The first dance was a traditional dance that tells the story of how Dhinawan (meaning emu in the Gamilaraay language) went to the sky as told by Aunty Bronwyn. The students then learnt two contemporary dances choreographed and shared by the instructors. The students learnt the stories behind the dances, words from the Gamilaraay and Wiradjiri languages and ways to connect to country through dance. Everyone had a wonderful time and, as always, the students represented themselves, the school and their culture proudly.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The school is pleased to announce that it will be running a healthcare initiative called the **Student Eye care Program.** An optometrist will be onsite during school hours to provide students with a comprehensive eye examination.

Parents will receive a report regarding their child's eye health and a prescription will be provided if glasses are required. Suggestions will be made for spectacles with options to access very affordable frame and lens packages. Alternatively free glasses can be obtained through Vision Australia- Criteria apply.

The program's aim is to detect visual problems that may interfere with a student's learning abilities and subsequently hinder their academic potential. A significant number of students have visual problems that go undetected; these are mainly inadequate focusing and eye teaming abilities that could lead to symptoms such as poor concentration, fatigue, headaches and unwillingness to read.

This eye health service is available to all students and is covered by Medicare Australia – so there is no cost to the students with a valid Medicare number. Those students with no Medicare card who wish to be tested, will need to pre-pay \$50.00 to Mobileyes Commonwealth Bank BSB: 062 124 account: 11750716 (Use your Child's name as the reference) prior to the testing day.

One book per household - "Pig the Pug" various fun titles, craft item and all art materials needed to complete the craft for each child registered.


