Keep up the momentum for change: the theme for National Reconciliation Week 2023 is *Be a Voice for Generations*.

The theme encourages all Australians to be a **voice for reconciliation** in tangible ways in our everyday lives – where we **live**, **work** and **socialise**.

For the work of **generations past**, and the benefit of **generations future**, act today for a more **just**, **equitable and reconciled country for all.**

National Reconciliation Week – **27 May to 3 June** – is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

This year we spoke to our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders students about how they would like to mark Reconciliation Week and put their ideas to a vote (as we could not do all the ideas). Here's what they decided.

- 1. Everyone in the school to please colour/ paint/ craft an Aboriginal or Torres Straight Island flag to create a sea of flags around our school flag poles. The flags are now visible on the grassed area near the flag poles.
- 2. Classes play Traditional Indigenous games and sports or join with other classes to play these games.
- 3. All families within the school community were invited to the school to participate in a class Reconciliation Week activity on Tuesday, 30th May from 2pm -3pm.
